



As of 7/7/2023: Standards for the Appropriate Use of Facial Coverings for Infection Control at Colonial Assisted Living Facility/ Colonial Skilled Nursing Facility

Health care providers, contractors, students and volunteers are no longer required to wear facial coverings.

Facial covering may be encouraged for anyone that is exhibiting signs or symptoms of or has a diagnosed infectious disease that can be spread through droplet or airborne transmission. Health care providers, contractors, students, visitors and volunteers have the right to Opt-Out of wearing facial coverings as long as there isn't a COVID-19 breakout at this time mask will be required.

Health care providers will be required to wear facial covering when: conducting sterile procedures, working in a sterile area, working with a patient that has been diagnosed with or confirmed of having an increased risk of transmission of an infection and the practitioner has determined the use of facial coverings necessary for the patient's safety or with a patient is on droplet or airborne precautions.
